


The Prez Sez...

Keep your Fall walking shoes on and come join us for our next walk. Taking place on Saturday, November 6, is our Little Bohemia Pie Walk. This event will take place at the American Postal Worker's Union, AFL-CIO, located at 1270 S. 13th St. With a start time of 9 a.m.—12 noon, walk at your own place and finish your walk by 3 p.m.

Bring a pie! We will walk the trail and then enjoy pie and coffee with our fellow walkers. Extra pie will go to New Visions Shelter. If you would like to walk with a group, get there a few minutes before 9:30 a.m. There will be a 5k (3 mi) and 10k (6 mi) option. Cost is \$3 for all walkers and children in strollers are free. Children accompanying adults will receive a free award. Please help protect our volunteers by masking when you are in the registration area.

For all history buffs, take a stroll through Little Bohemia and Little Italy and find out about these groups that have added to America's melting pot.

To get there: take 13th St. to 13th & William. The APWU is on the northwest corner. Take the entrance on the northeast side of the building. There is parking in the APWU lot behind the building as well as the Bohemian Café parking lot across the street. Note the mural on the back of the building!

Also coming up is our annual Lights Walk, which will be take place at Urban Abbey, located downtown at 1026 Jackson St. in Omaha's Old Market district. The start time

is 4:00—6:00 p.m. and off the trail by 8:00. Cost is \$3 for all walker and children in strollers are free. Pets are not allowed inside the building.

Come and enjoy the holiday and the spectacular light displays at the shops and eateries in the downtown area. This walk will offer a 5k and 10k route! You can decide at the checkpoint which you would prefer to do. The routes are all on sidewalks and paved paths, but curbs may be difficult to navigate in Omaha's Old Market. Along with our host, Urban Abbey, we will be collecting diapers and wipes for the YES (Youth Emergency Services) Maternity Group Home. Sizes 3 and 4 are most in demand for their outreach program. We will be selling "diaper shares" (suggested donation of \$5). Donations are not required in order to walk.

Directions: From the east: I-480 into NE, left on 10th St. to Jackson St. From the west: I-480 northbound to Leavenworth St. Right on Leavenworth to S. 13th St. Left on S. 13th to Jackson St. Parking in the Old Market is not free. There is a pay lot across the street from Urban Abbey, and metered parking in the areas with parking garages to the north and west.

Sandy peaks

This article was written by Lucinda Mays from Chadron. These are some highlights of the Chadron State College YRE. Look for information on the other two walks in upcoming newsletters.

Chadron State College Walk, Chadron, NE by Lucinda Mays

Chadron State College's trails curve through the natural terrain of Nebraska's Pine Ridge that form the south boundary of campus. The north end of the trail takes hikers past pollinator-attracting wildflower beds, water catchments for windbreaks of native trees, and new student housing landscapes filled with high plains low-water-use plants.

The buffalo grass trail carries pedestrians past an intentionally developed water-conserving landscape of the college's Rangeland Complex, which is home to CSC's rodeo team and rangeland program.

On a clear day, as the trail continues west, buttes and other rock formations in Dawes County can be seen from the trail. The historic C-Hill, which was built in 1924, is passed on this route and a quick jaunt to the top offers views of the southern Black Hills of South Dakota. Just past C-Hill and



as the trail meanders to the south, hikers can stop by the CSC Labyrinth, a project designed and created by the Art Department and community volunteers. The labyrinth was

built in an abandoned water cistern that once served as Chadron's water storage tank and provides respite in nature and an opportunity for reflection and contemplation to those who enter.

The Mari Sandoz Heritage Trail, the concrete trail locally known as the "Snake," winds through the Thompson Natural History Preserve and is highlighted by crossing the upper dam at Briggs Pond and coursing to a scenic overlook of the city at the top. Benches allow users to rest and take in views. This trail connects back to the grass trail, traversing above the college's new track and past the starting line of the cross country course, or brings users out to the recently-renovated football stadium and Chicoine Center, home of the college's athletic department.

Elections and Voting




Elections for our 2022 Club Officers and 2021 Walker of the Year are coming up! Every adult club member with an email address will

In Remembrance



Dannie Peters, of Lennox, SD, died Monday, October 25, 2021 at Sanford USD Medical Center, Sioux Falls, SD from complications of a heart condition.

Dannie Gene Peters was born on May 9, 1943, near Chancellor, SD, the son of George G. and Alice Mae (Timmerman)

Peters. He attended rural school and then graduated from Lennox High School in 1961. He went on to earn an associates degree from the Community College of the Air Force in business and accounting.

On January 11, 1962 he entered the US Air Force where he served honorably for 24 years until his honorable discharge and retirement on August 31, 1985. He attained the rank of SM Sgt and had earned several meritorious and commendation medals and ribbons for his outstanding service. Dannie was also awarded an outstanding unit award for his various roles in the finance area the US Air Force.



The 10k route adds on a visit to the Creighton University campus and the Hot Shops Winter Open House. Our checkpoint for both routes will be at Omaha Virtual Reality in the Capitol District.

We will <u>not</u> be collecting toilet paper nor gloves, hats and the like this year. Instead, our host has asked that we donate diapers, especially sizes 3 and 4, to support the church's outreach program with YES – Maternity Group Home. Diapers are not covered by any social benefit program and are very expensive for anyone on a tight budget. So, we're offering "diaper shares" for a \$5 donation!
