

However it is time for me to pass the torch. We will be having our annual election of officers coming up sometime soon before our December club meeting.

Also coming up soon is our annual Lights Walk which will be taking place on Saturday December 3<sup>rd</sup>. The Lights Walk this year is sponsored by KANEKO and The RiverFront. This annual event will take place this year at KANEKO at 1111 Jones St in Omaha's Old Market. The start table will be open from 4pm-6pm, off the trail by 8pm. This walk will offer a 5k and a 10k loop. The 5k will be stroller friendly.

Come and enjoy the holiday and the spectacular light displays at the shops and eateries in the downtown area. The routes are all on sidewalks and paved paths, but curbs may be difficult to navigate in Omaha's Old Market.

We will be collecting diapers for the Lydia House at this event, which is an emergency shelter for Women and families. So start looking for diapers on sale, and please bring some diapers to donate to the Lydia House. We will also be offering hot drinks and cookies at this event, so please think about volunteering to bring some home baked cookies. There will be lots of door prizes at this event, and pets are also allowed in KANEKO.

Parking in the Old Market is not free, and we suggest using a pay lot. There is a paid lot to the West of the start and to the northeast. Directions: From the east: I-480 into NE, left on 10<sup>th</sup> St. to Jackson St. From west: I-480 northbound to Leavenworth St. Right on Leavenworth to S.13<sup>th</sup> St. Left on S 13<sup>th</sup> to Jones St. Pay lot at 10<sup>th</sup> & Jackson and 12<sup>th</sup> & Jones St.

And finally, please mark your calendars for our annual January dinner meeting, which will be taking place on Saturday January 21, 2023. Our annual dinner meeting will be taking place once again at Legends Bar & Grill, located at 6920 Pacific St in Omaha. All other proceeds go to benefit those in our community who are in need.






