I appreciate each and every one of you for wanting to join us in Fun Fitness and Friendship!

In this newsletter I thought I would update you on what kind of events that our club hosts. The AVA (American Volkssport Association) likes to use a lot of abbreviations which always confused me when I was just starting out in this club.

How to locate events: Whatever state you travel through, you can always find an event listed on the AVA.org website by clicking "Locate Events," select the state, then click "Search Events." This is fun and club rewarding that we walk on other clubs' trails. Just follow the instructions on the event.


Traditional Events are usually one or two day events and the hosting club will be at the Start Point, Check Points and Finish Table at specific times, books are stamped; there is a \$3 fee.

YRE (Year Round Events) are events that will instruct you to register at a specific location that has a "Walk Box" or an "Online Start Box" and can be walked whenever you want by yourself. \$3 fee.

Seasonal Events are only held during specific times of the year because of weather and are carried out just like YREs.

ACE Events (AVA Community Events) are event walks that can be less than 10K and no books are stamped. They are free yet are sanctioned events by the AVA with the intent of providing more community outreach.

The *Traveling Stamp* is used by our club to hold events, usually during the week or at short notice that are guided walks. Books can be stamped for credit. ~*Lori Sue*

We finished the week with another spot I had never been to-Heron Haven. No herons were to be found, but lots of ducks, geese and turtles. Just a touch of spring. It is a must to go back when the plants are in bloom.

Our first traveling stamp walk was held at Arrowhead Park in Neola, Iowa. Again, Mother Nature did not smile on us, but Tressa had laid out a great route and we all dressed for the weather. It snowed just enough to make us smile. The hillside was covered with bloodroot just getting ready to bloom. I had never seen so much in one spot. After the walk, we all enjoyed lunch in Tressa's great cabin. Lots of sleeping room in this cabin, two bathrooms and nice kitchen. I think this is what you call Glamping.

Don't worry if you missed some of these walks. We promise lots more to come. The Traveling Stamp makes it easy to schedule an event with short notice. We promise to keep them coming. By the time the newsletter comes out, Lake Manawa, Lake Cunningham and maybe even Chadron will be walks of the past. National Trails Day will be June 3 and we plan to have a walk starting at Seymour Smith Park.

And plan for some great events this fall.

First is a new event in the planning to celebrate a small town's big accomplishment. In the Village of Table Rock, named for a unique rock formation near the Nemaha River in Nebraska, a small country schoolhouse was built of native rock, quarried nearby, and constructed by German and Czech immigrants in 1873. This school has been lovingly restored. To celebrate the school's 150 year anniversary, they will host a 5k volksmarch through fields and pastures beginning and ending at the school building. This will commemorate the thousands of children that walked up to 2 miles to school each day in the early days of the state. This walk will be held on Labor Day, September 4, the traditional day before the start of the school year. Watch for details coming soon.

A little later in September, another traveling event takes place when the Regional Roundup is held in the Rock Valley area. This is a chance to meet fellow walkers from throughout the North Central Region. Our club is hosting the Le Mars walk. Eight other walks are planned for over the weekend plus an evening of pizza and fun and games and a dinner meeting that will include Le Mars' famous Blue Bunny Ice Cream. Registration is needed by August 18, so if you haven't seen the brochure yet, look for one at a meeting or let a board member know that you need one.

On November 4, NWFT will be celebrating another big milestone. It will be our 500th walking event. Since 1979, when we hosted our first event which brought 350 walkers to Plattsmouth, Nebraska, we have hosted walks in communities throughout Nebraska and Southwest Iowa. From marathons to short ACE events, we have explored architecture, history, culture and Mother Nature.

We are hosting the walk in the same church we hosted our 150th walk in. We will explore the historic Hanscom Park area and the Field Club trail. Bring a pie (I personally love the homemade ones!). We walk and share pie after the walk then share the leftovers with a local shelter. In addition to great pie, we plan to a have a beautiful A award patch and a display of past events.

So much to look forward to!!!! And don't forget our YRE's and seasonals. If you have not gotten out yet this spring, take advantage of the beautiful weather while it is here. Hot summer will quickly creep up on us. We walked Council Bluffs this past week and the flowers were gorgeous.
