is a beauty! Downtown Omaha has a new start point and all new paths to wander. The start point will be familiar to those of you who did the Lights walk in past Decembers. The start box is now behind the security counter in the lobby of the Landmark Center at 12th & Farnam. It is in a yellow folder. Check out the picture of the "start box" at the end of this article. They are open dawn to dusk.

Parking is a little easier downtown these days once you get the hang of it. You can go to the Park Omaha website for all of the parking garages in the area. Of course, there is one connected to the Landmark Center but there are less expensive options if you are willing to walk a little ways. And street parking is much easier. Park and look at the section number on the post by the car. Go to one of the blue boxes and read the instructions. You will need your car's plate number. You can pay with cash or with a credit card. Just put in how many hours you want to park and it will calculate the total for you. They will even text you a receipt. And if you are a little more techy than I am, you can download the app and pay that way.

The walk itself has been redesigned by Jeanne. One 5K loop travels through the three RiverFront Parks and to the Bob Kerrey Bridge. Meet Omar and get a border crossing after becoming acquainted with the newest parks. The parks are filled with new sights. The pier is a fantastic addition with views east and west, river and skyline. The playground by the Luminarium is so unique, I would love to spend an afternoon playing. The second 5 K loop will look a little more familiar with some of our favorite downtown sites including the Old Market, the Orpheum, The Rose Theater, St. Mary Magdalene Church, The Spirit of

Nebraska's Wilderness Park, Pioneer Courage Park and so much more. I hope you have a chance to try out this new walk.


